Description

and purportedly inspired his painting <i>Evening: The End of Day (After Millet)</i> (1889). The frame is gold with a white mat. The poem translates to English as: "Under the twilight and brown / the peasant twice bronze / His forehead bathed in the pale sky / Returns his work done" (poem by Breton).
